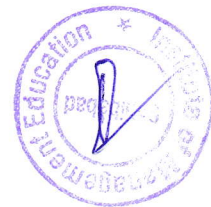

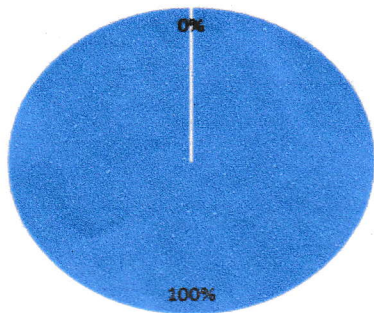

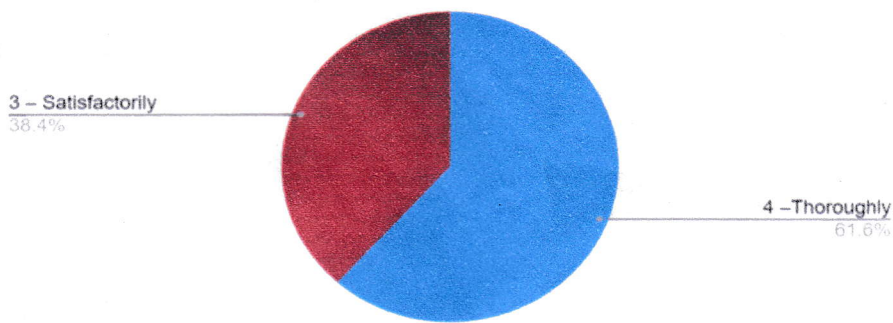

1. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?

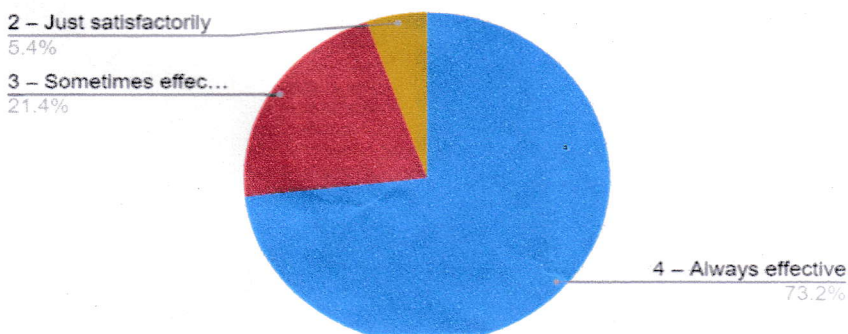

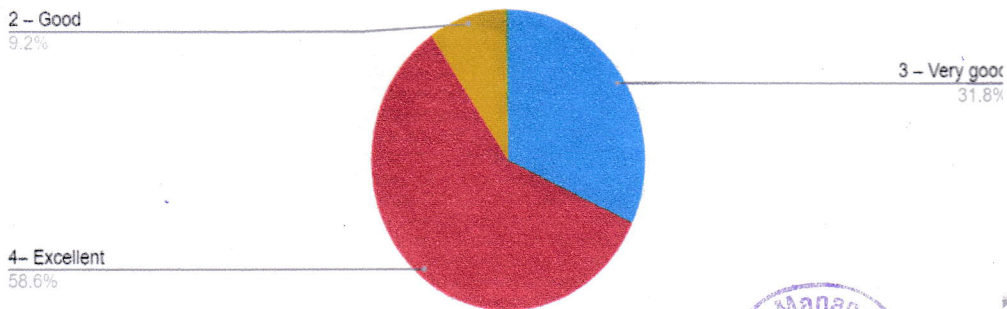

Count of 4. The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as

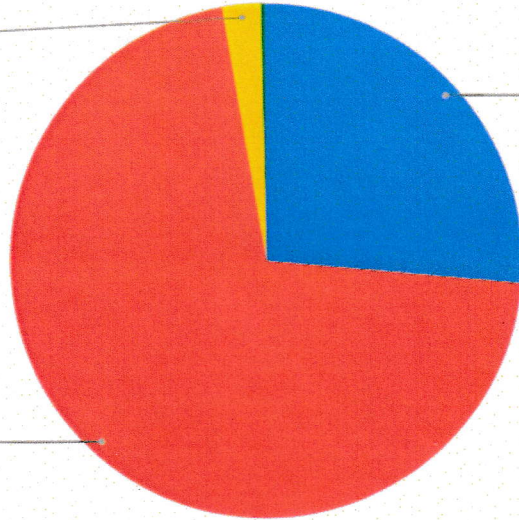


Count of 5. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers.

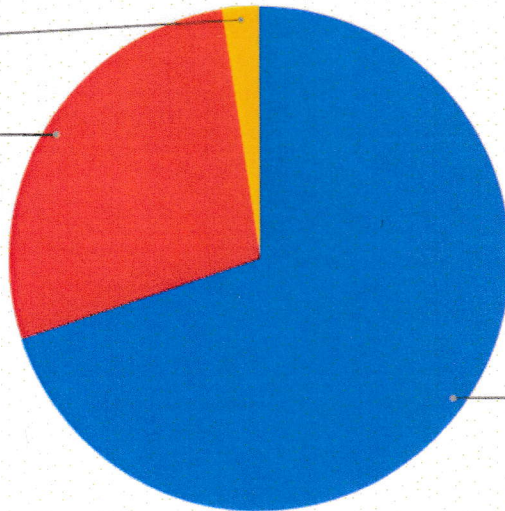


Count of 6. Was your performance in assignments discussed with you?

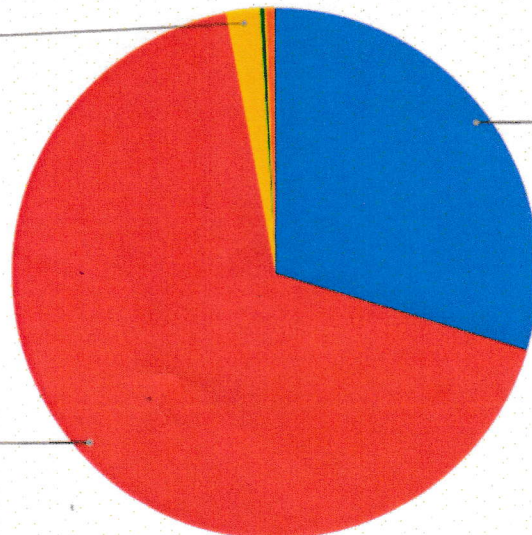


Count of 7. The institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities for stu...

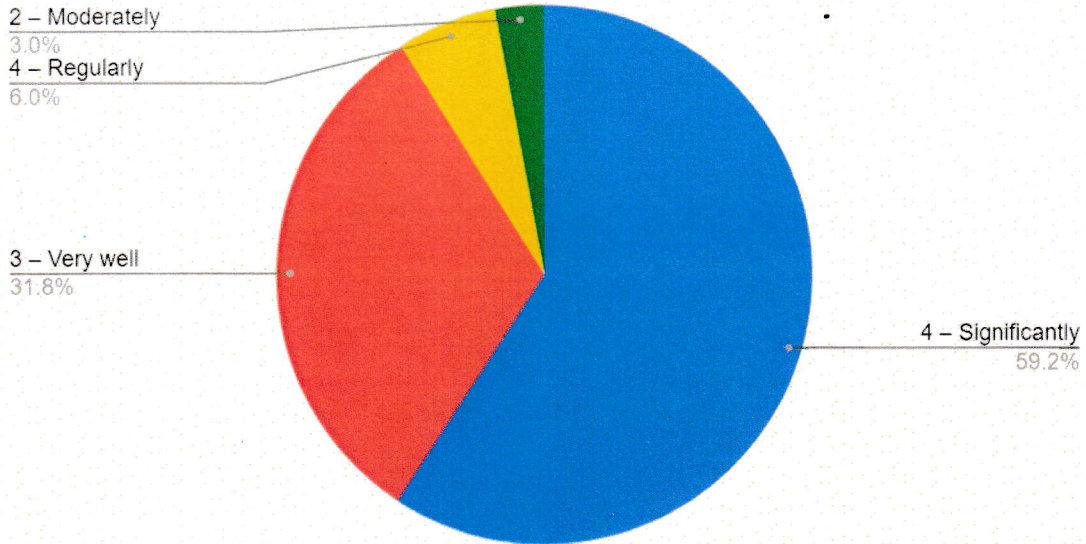

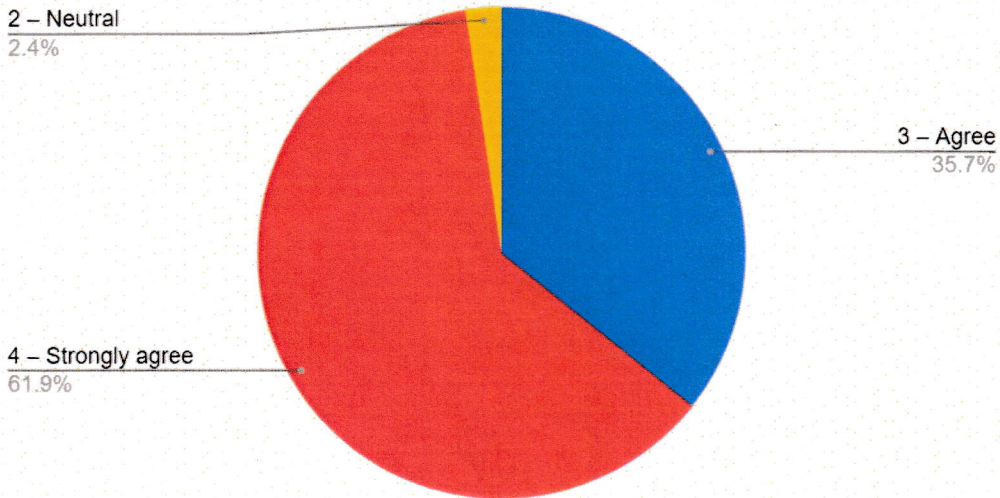

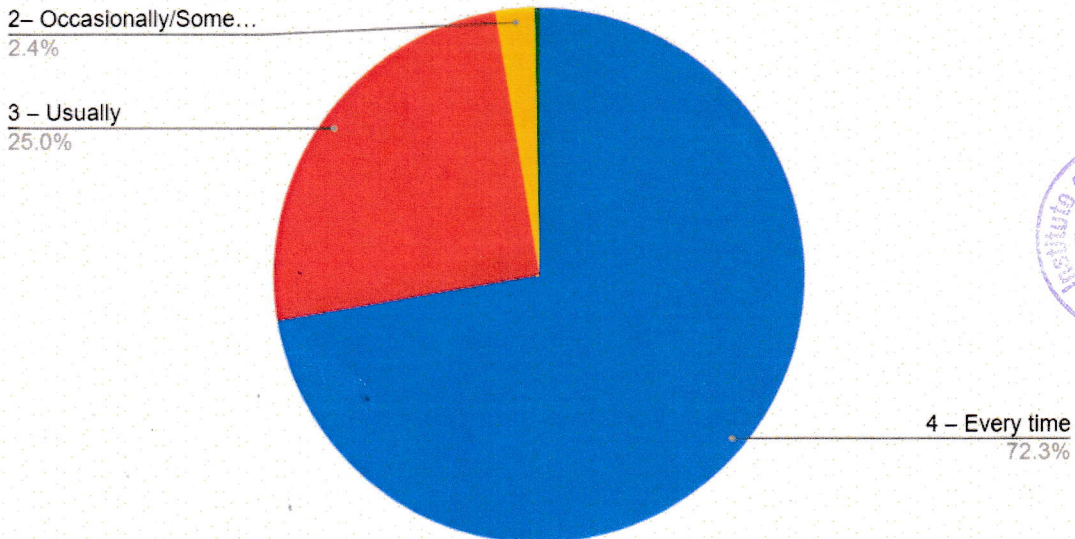
Count of 8. The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional gr...



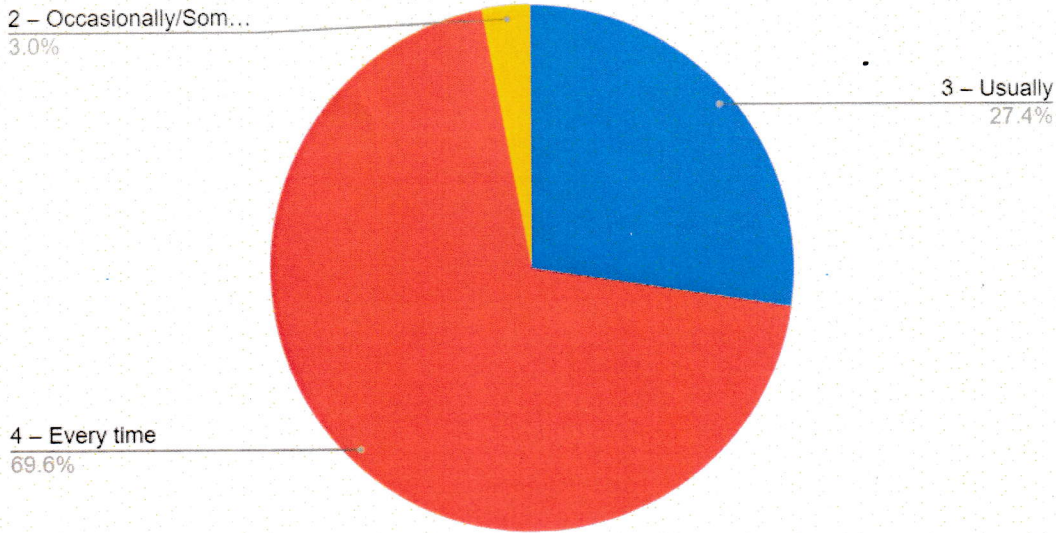
Count of 9. The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow.



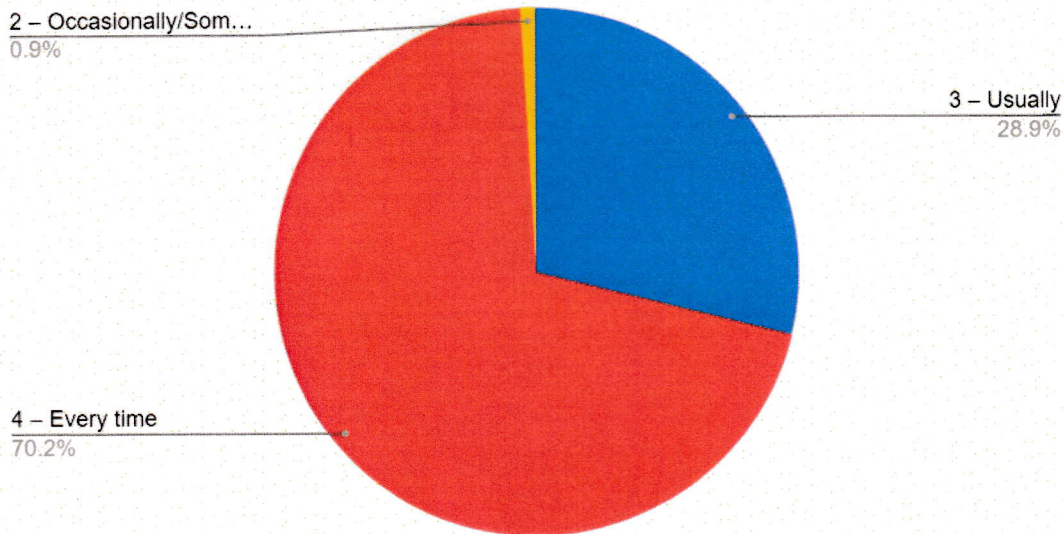
Count of 10. Teachers inform you about your expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes.



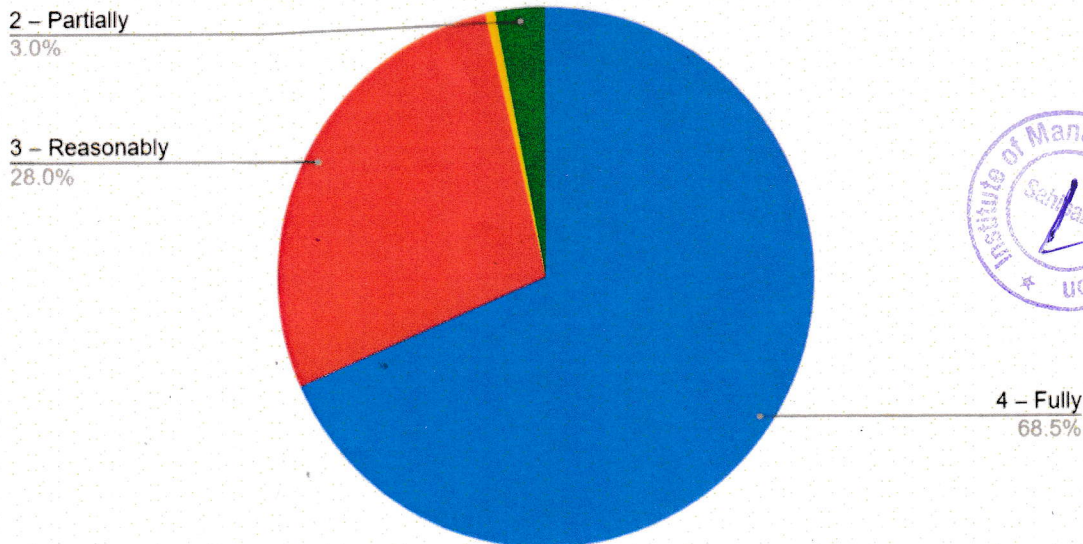
Count of 11. Your mentor does a necessary follow-up with a...



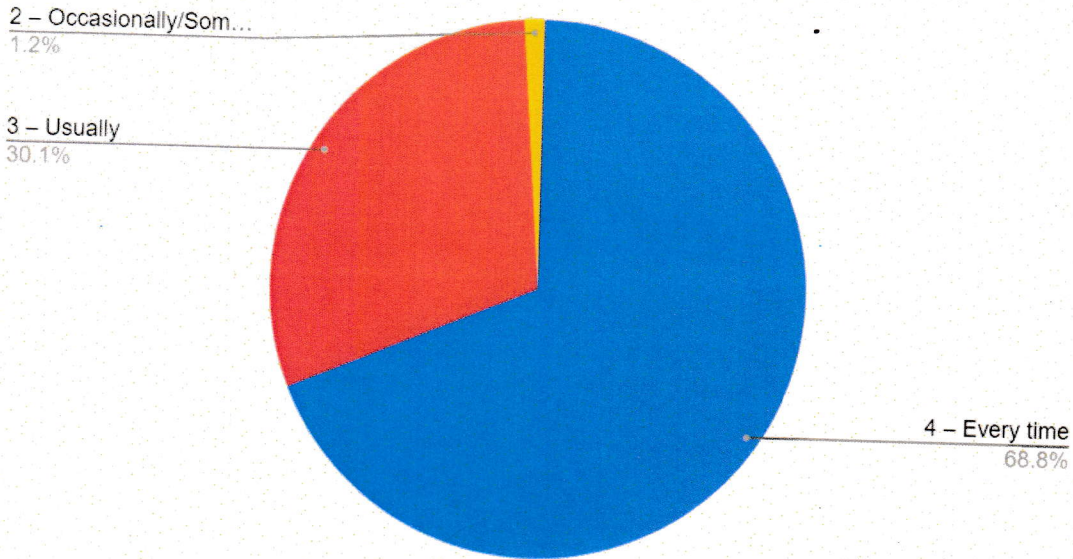
Count of 12. The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications.



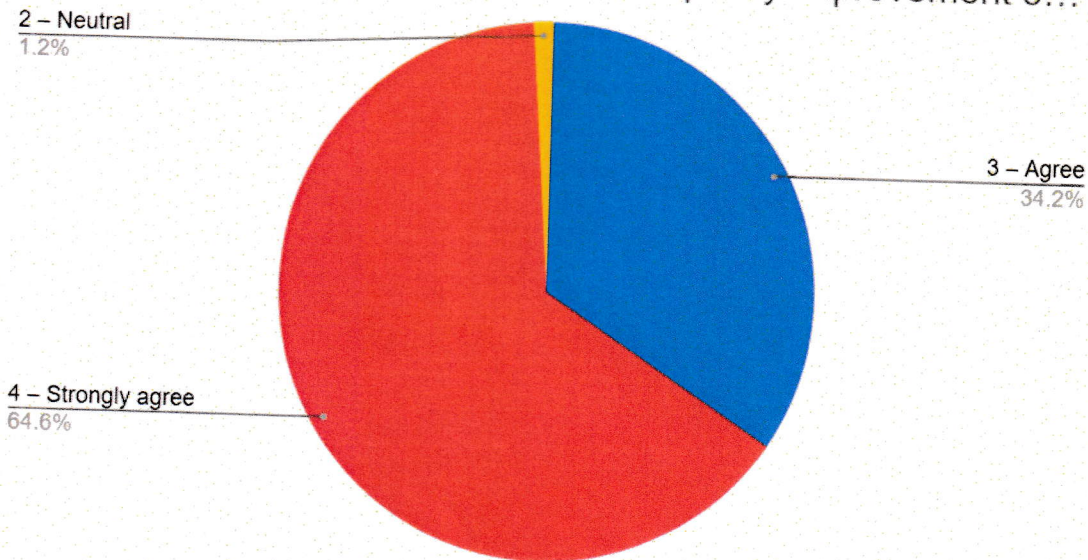
Count of 13. The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges.



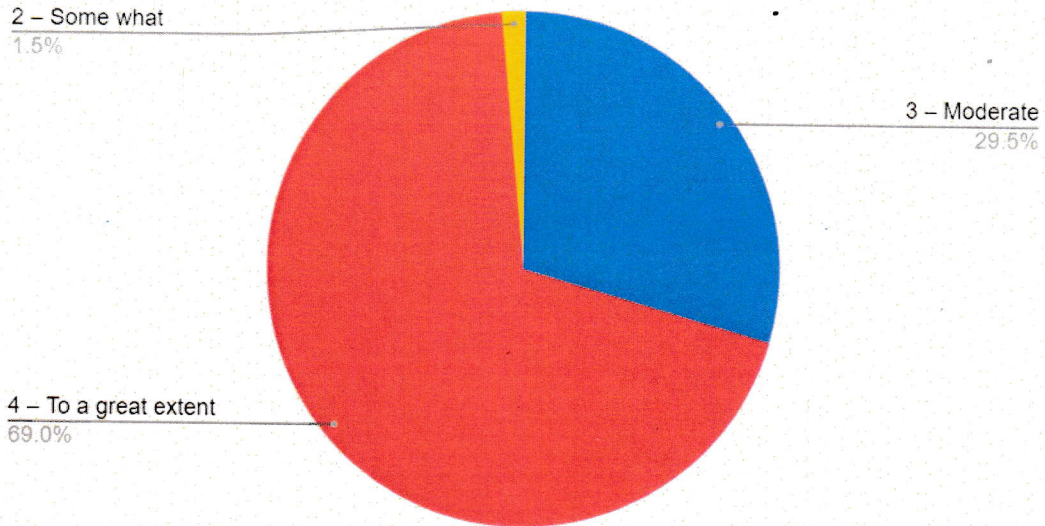
Count of 14. Teachers are able to identify your weaknesses and help you to overcome them.



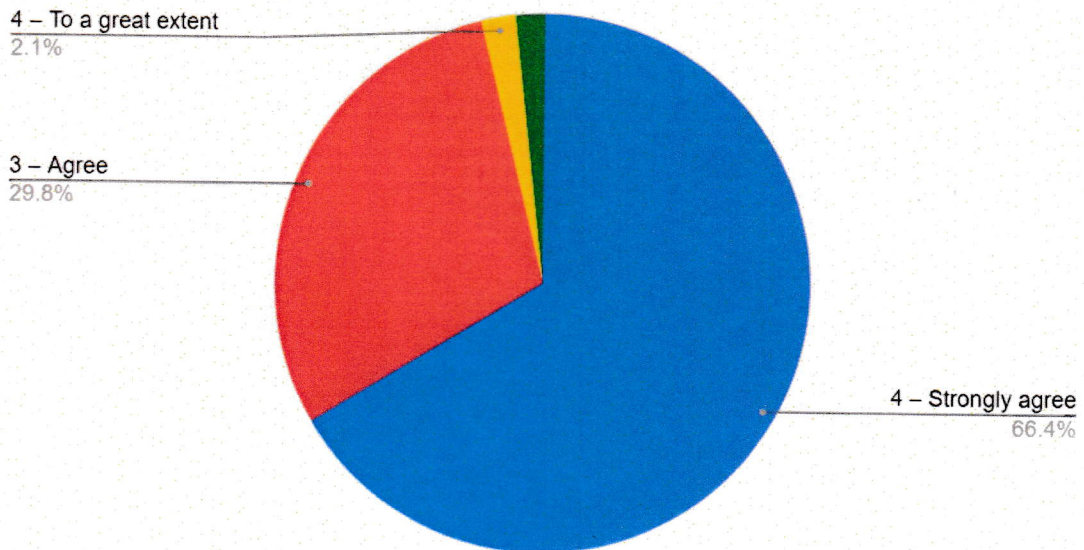

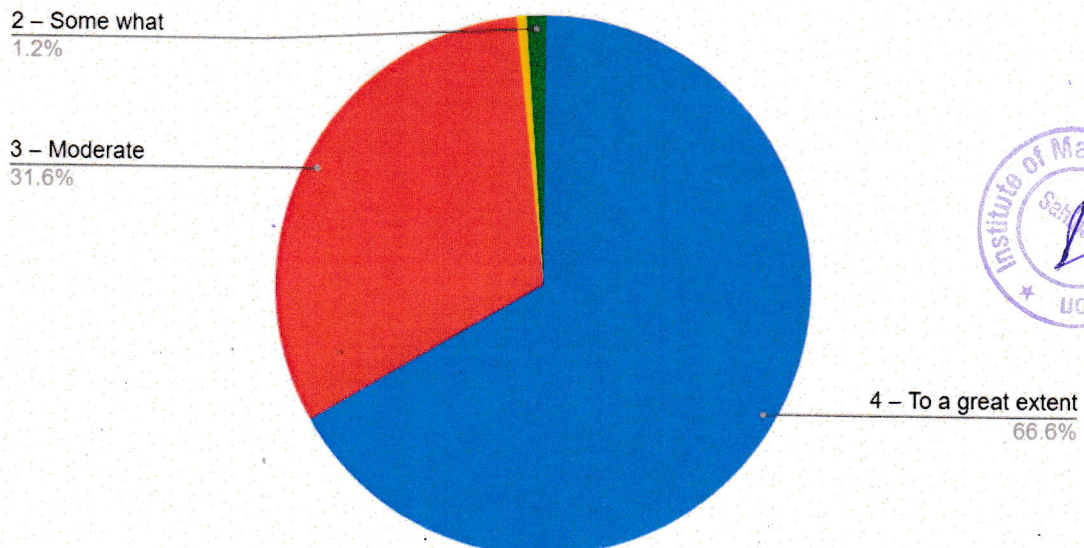

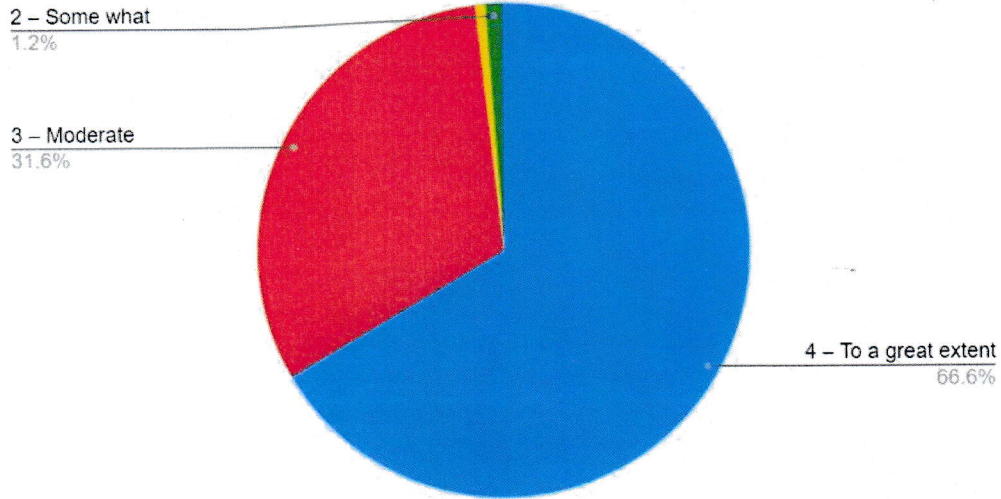
Count of 17. Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities.



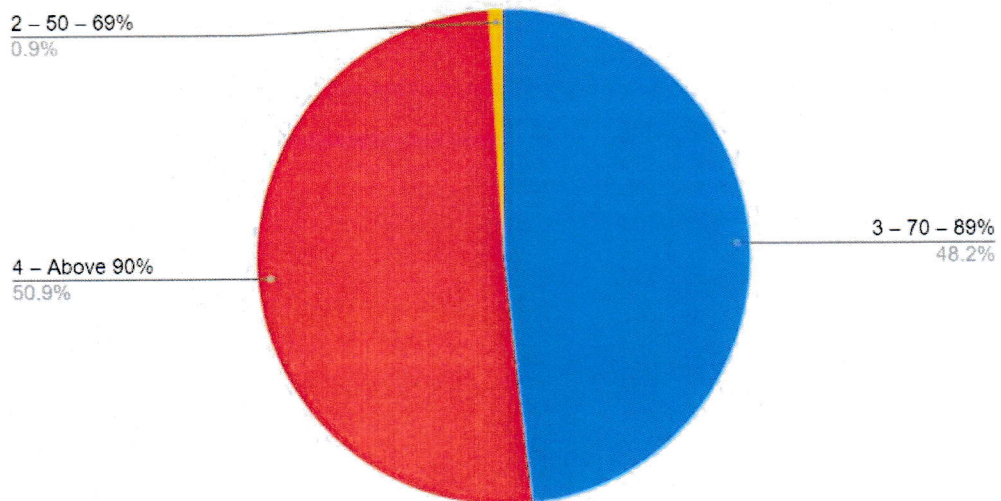
Count of 18. Efforts are made by the institute/ teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make...



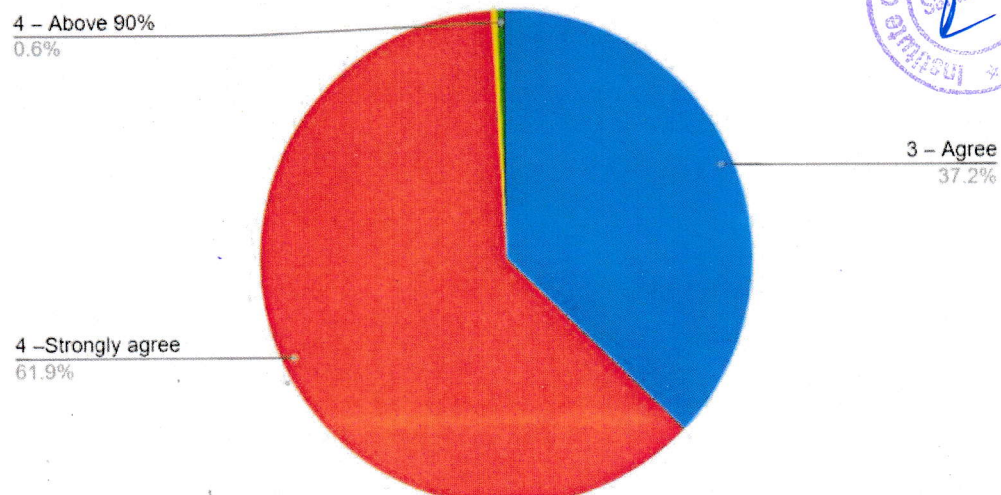

Count of 19. What percentage of teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, Multimedia, etc. while teaching.



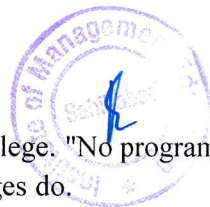
Count of 20. The overall quality of teaching-learning process in your institute is very good.
